# AN UPDATE FROM THE PRESIDENT...

## Compatriots & Friends of the Cincinnati Chapter SAR,

First let me wish everyone a healthy and prosperous New year! I am honored and privileged to be the 88<sup>th</sup> President of the Cincinnati Chapter.

We are proud of the fact that the Cincinnati Chapter has been recognized as the number one SAR chapter in America. This has been a consistent accomplishment for our chapter. This track record is the result of having a dedicated team of leaders and members who contribute to the goals of our chapter. As a result we have the track record, the statistics, the awards and the credentials to back it up.

So, what should the goals be for the number one chapter in America? It can't be to make us great. It can't be to make us great again or to make us great again, again. We are already currently at a high point in many ways. Despite this, I believe there are several ways that we can improve, address our looming threats and weaknesses, and take better advantage of the opportunities before us. Below are a few that I feel are the most important ones.

**Membership.** We must focus on the three R's (Recruitment, Retention, and Reinstatement) to maintain and grow membership in an increasingly challenging environment. Although our chapter's 2023-year end membership was near an all-time high with 255 members, it was still slightly below the levels of 2019 and 2020, and the trend over the past five years is flat.

**Publicity.** We must increase our public exposure. While our SAR organized ceremonies and events are wonderful, the fact is that many draw very few attendees from the public. I believe we must get out to some major public events organized by others, so that hundreds and thousands of people can see us and learn who we are and what we do. That includes capitalizing on public events related to the nation's 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

**Sustaining Our Excellence.** While the Cincinnati Chapter is fortunate to have established several areas of excellence, sometimes called the "pillars" of the chapter, these are heavily dependent on a few dedicated, passionate individuals. Depth is not a strong point, and recent experience has shown that when a key person steps down, filling those roles has been a challenge. This means that we are not well positioned to sustain our areas of excellence indefinitely into the future. We are seeking members who want to get more actively involved. This is something I hope to start to address.

I look forward to working together. Thanks to everyone for their continued membership and loyalty to the Sons of the American Revolution.

## Veterans Day Luncheon —Mason—Saturday Nov. 4th

On Saturday November 4th we held our annual Veterans Day luncheon at the Manor House in Mason.

This event was attended by the Cincinnati SAR, members of three DAR chapters and members of the CAR (Children of the American Revolution).

Our keynote speaker was 96 year old World War II Veteran Frank Wetenkamp. Frank shared his life and military experiences and told us of his life experiences as Gunnery Specialist aboard the USS Lindewald – LSD 6.

Frank's military service to our country started when he enrolled in the military in 1943 at the adult age of 17. Frank gained early respect as fighter and leader. "Give it to Frank, he can get it done" was his calling card.

Frank acknowledged that his generation is commonly referred to as the "Greatest Generation" due to the timing of World War I, II and Korea. He admitted that after learning more about the history of the American Revolution, the founding fathers signed "death warrants" for their pursuit of rebellion and independence from the powerful British military. Frank noted that these original founding fathers were truly the "Greatest Generation".

To put this in perspective, our patriot ancestors and their leaders were fighting for a then unknown way of life where the "People Ruled" vs a dictator and or royalty. These patriots had no guarantees if their sacrifices were to be rewarded with individual freedoms or death. Frank admitted that all wars after the fight for American independence were fought to preserve freedoms that America's founders and patriots earned via bloodshed.

We were honored to have Frank W. Wetenkamp speak to us.

To this day, this gentleman is full of energy and passion for helping others as evidenced by his at least once a week visit to the area Veterans Hospitals to visit and support America's military is inspiring.





## Veterans Day Ceremony—Friday Nov. 10th MARS Hill Academy

On Friday November 10th, the MARS Hills Academy (MHA) had a school assembly where they celebrated Veterans Day. This is an annual event for this institution of Christian guided learning for grades K-12.

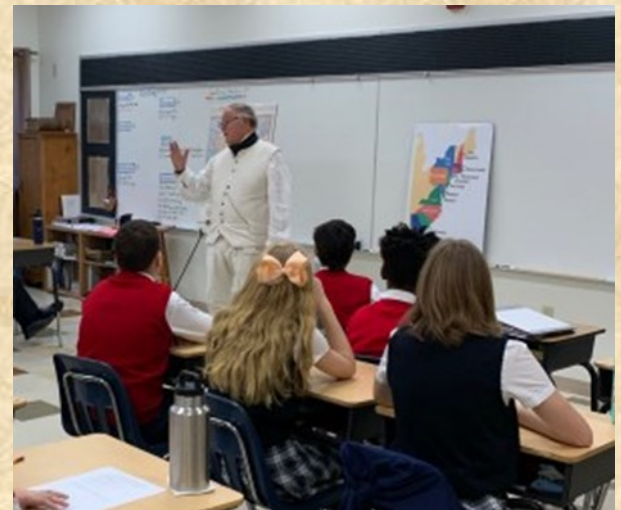

## Pearl Harbor Day / Flag Retirement Day— Sunday 12/3

On a day which will live in infamy .....

On Sunday December 3rd, 2023 the Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution participated in Flag Retirement event and a Pearl Harbor Day parade which included a boat ride onto the Ohio River for a Wreath Laying Ceremony.

This Sunday was a solemn damp, overcast, gusty and cold day. Regardless, our spirits were warmed by the knowledge we were recognizing those who sacrificed during the day infamy experienced during the December 7<sup>th</sup>, 1941 attacks on the US military in Pearl Harbor.

We started the day with a flag retirement ceremony at the American Legion Post 534. Mike Gunn of the Cincinnati Chapter welcomed the audience. The Color Guard members fired a three round musket salute to conclude the ceremony.

At that point, the participants transitioned upriver to the Anderson Ferry location on River Road (US 50). The groups paraded down to an awaiting ferry where we loaded onto the Anderson Ferry. From there the barge motored into the current of the Ohio River.

Once away from shore, the barge was skillfully stopped in place and the participants threw bio-degradable wreaths into the waters of the Ohio River.

This ceremony was to emulate the wreath laying efforts which occurred in Pearl Harbor.

There were numerous civic and community groups participating in both these events.

All in all a very somber event where we had heavy hearts thinking about the lives lost at Pearl Harbor and all US military conflicts where lives were lost and lives changed as a result of experiences and the life long scars inflicted on the men, women and children of the US Military.

## Wreaths Across America—Saturday Dec. 16

On Saturday December 16th in Spring Grove Cemetery a special event took place called Wreaths Across America (WAA).

Similar events occurred at Greenwood Cemeteries and the Veterans Home of Georgetown.

Within Spring Grove cemetery there is a Civil War section where the remains of almost 1000 union veterans of the Civil War were buried. These graves are laid in a circular pattern within three mounds peaked by a vertical period cannon.

Most of these veterans came from the local Civil War hospital at Camp Dennison on Cincinnati's east side.

On this day, wreaths were laid by volunteers on the simple white granite headstones of those fallen.

The event started 12:00 noon to coincide with the over 4,200 WAA events occurring simultaneously across the country.

Cincinnati Sons of the American Revolution President Scott Freeman greeted the participants with a story of the history of the WAA event as well as the history of the fallen here at Spring Grove Cemetery.

There was a moment of silence, followed by the placing of ceremonial Wreaths representing each branch of military service.

Volunteers distributed the wreaths and placed them on the base of the soldiers grave stones.

Following the closing remarks, the Nolan Carson Color Guard of the Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution performed a three volley musket salute to honor those who have fallen in service to our country.

Taps was played to close the ceremony.

Thanks to the participants and the members of the community who supported this effort.

# GRAVE MARKING—WASHINGTON PARK—NOV 12TH



On Sunday November 12th, the Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution held a Patriot Grave Marking Ceremony in Washington Park (downtown Cincinnati).

We joined to recognize five Revolutionary War Patriots who died in Hamilton County. This ongoing effort will recognize all Revolutionary War Patriots who are known to have been buried in Hamilton County Ohio. These grave marking events will continue to the July 4th 2026 which is the recognized 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence.



Starting the day's activities, Mike Gunn of the Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (CCSAR) gave a presentation in Memorial Hall to a focused audience. The topic was "Washington's Eyes".

There is a bronze marker in Memorial Hall listing the 250+ Revolutionary War Patriots known to be buried in Hamilton County Ohio.



The Patriots honored today:

- Adam Boss (1762-1833) – served with Maryland Militia
- Nathaniel Clark (1757-1832) – served with Massachusetts and Rhode Island
- Duncan Dunn (1752-1838) – served as Sgt. with NY and Vermont
- Joseph Hall (1761-1818) – served with Morgan's 11th Regiment
- Richard S. Holden (1761-1831) – served with Massachusetts and at Valley Forge

There was also placing of ceremonial wreaths for organizations represented at the ceremony.

A commemorative three volley musket salute was performed by the Nolan Carson Memorial Color Guard, followed by a moment of reflection and mourning of arms display by the Color Guard.

The ceremony was concluded by the playing of taps.





# GRAVE MARKING—MYERS CEMETERY—GOSHEN

## OCTOBER 21ST



On a drizzly Saturday afternoon on October 21st, 2023 in the Myers Cemetery in Goshen Ohio members of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) hosted a Patriot Grave Marking event.

The event was coordinated around a meeting of the Central District SAR representing the states of Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana and West Virginia. Many respective chapter members and dignitaries of these states participated in and were recognized at the event.

We were honored to have the President General John L Dodd of the National SAR participate in the Central District events on Saturday. He addressed and inspected the Color Guard participants at the start of the event.

Mike Gunn of the Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (CCSAR) was the organizer and emcee for the activities of the day.

Lee Wilkerson of CCSAR and the Central District introduced the crowd to the six Patriots buried in the Myers Cemetery.

In attendance were members of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) as well as the Children of the American Revolution (CAR).

The main part of the event was the unveiling of SAR granite markers at the base of each of these patriots graves.

Another significant part of the event was the presentation of ceremonial wreaths from the many SAR, DAR, CAR and local civic groups who participated in this event.

There was a three round musket volley performed by the members of the Color Guard. Upon completion of the volleys, the Color Guard executed the "Mourn Arms" pose to quietly honor those we recognized today and for all others who we have lost.

Taps was played and completed the days events.

We were informed by his daughter Rose Alcorn that Richard had passed away in September 2023.

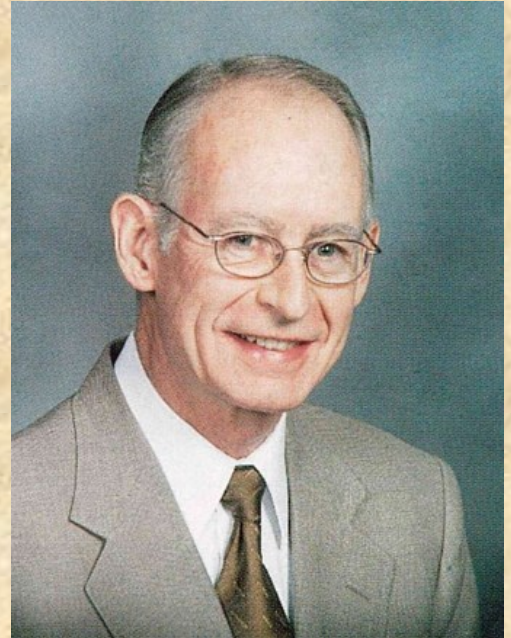
Richard spent his final time in Springfield Illinois and remained a Cincinnati Chapter member.

We are saddened to learn that Prescott Bigelow, 85, of Naples FL, passed away on December 22nd.

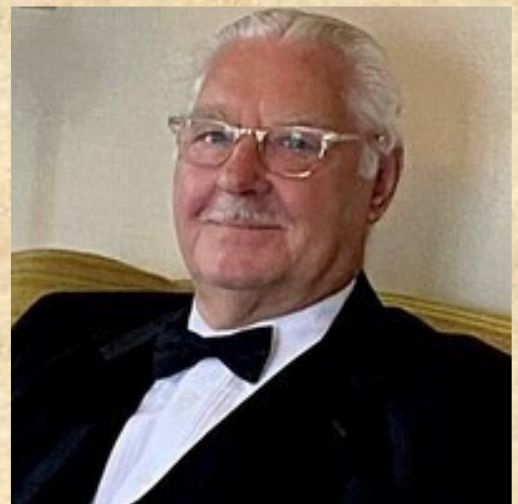
Prescott was born in Argentina and is survived by his wife Juanita "Nita" being married for over 60 years.

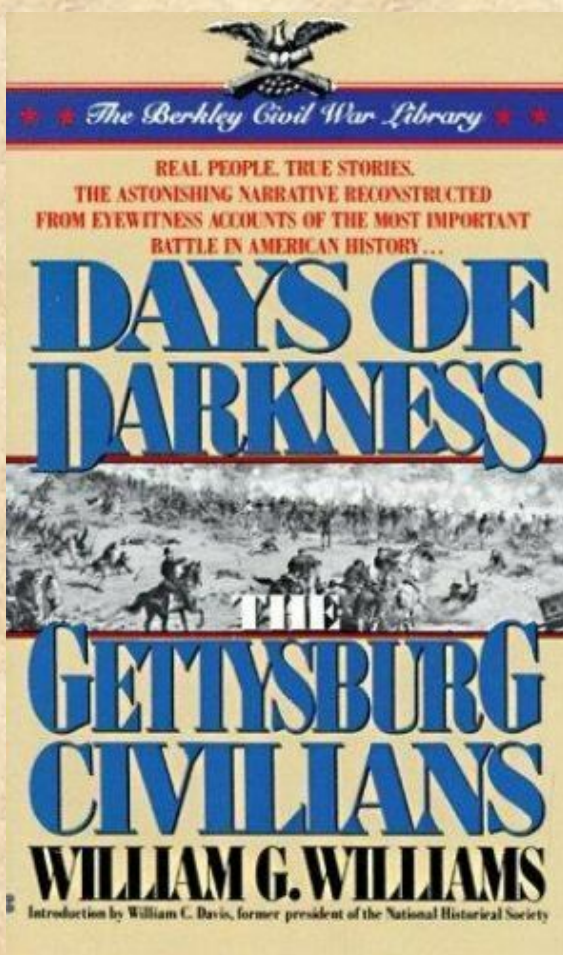
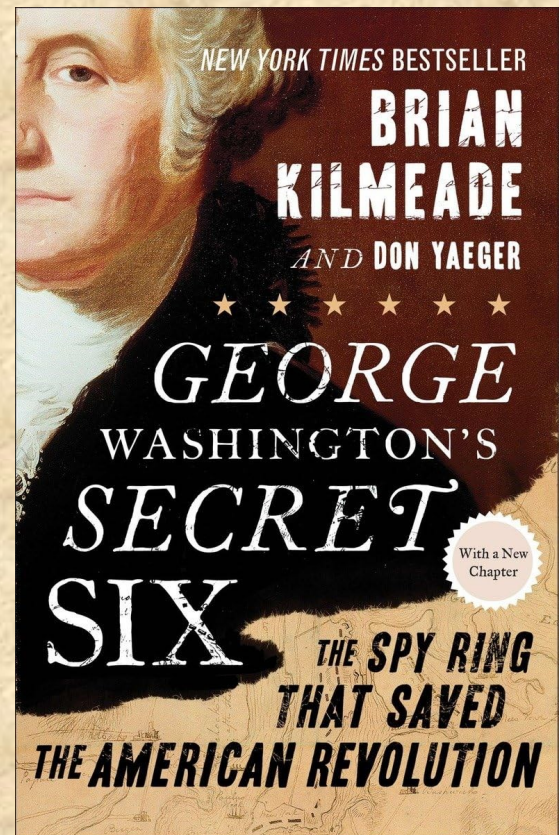
